Services:

You will again be asked to complete contact details on a Track and Trace form when attending any service until further notice.

The time of the **Crib Service** on Friday Dec 24th has been changed to **4.30pm**. Children (and Adults) are invited to dress up as **an Angel, a shepherd or a wise man!** We will be placing the nativity figures in the crib, though there will be a slightly different approach to this, and there will be some audience participation! There is currently still plenty of spaces, but if you wish to attend please pre-book by ringing Roy on 894738 on Wednesday or Friday after 9.30am.

You **do not** need to prebook for the Communion Service on Friday Dec 24th at 8.30pm, or for the Morning Worship on Sunday Dec 26th at 10am.

There are services to which you are invited on **Christmas Day** - Morning Worship at St. Andrew's at 9.30am, Holy Communion at St. Peter's at 10.00am or Holy Communion at 10.30am at St Thomas', Ashton. There is also a Holy Communion at St. Thomas' on Christmas Eve at 11pm to which you would be most welcome.

There is no Wednesday morning service on December 29th. The next midweek Holy Communion Service at St. Aidan's is on Wednesday 5th January at 10am.

In **January** the usual pattern of services is anticipated with the addition of a Christingle Service at 10am on Sunday January 9th. We do not know what restrictions may be imposed by Government, but we do not expect church services to be prohibited. We will take all needed precautions in respect of our members to keep each other safe. I would remind you that you should not attend a service if you have any symptoms of Covid, and it would be a courtesy to take a Lateral Flow test before attending.

We are struggling to fill the rotas for **stewards** at our services, both at 10am and at 4pm. If we cannot expand the team we may need to reduce the services to one each week. This would be most retrograde step. Our safety depends on sanitising after each service. If you would be willing to act as a steward at least once a month, or simply like to know more please talk to Helen or Peter Hughes. 01744 732890. There is a plastic box in the Narthex for donations of non-perishable food and toiletries when church is open for services. A full list of items required is on the noticeboard in the Narthex, and includes tinned fruit, UHT milk, Long-life juice, tinned tomatoes, packets of pasta in sauces and noodles, but **not** dried pasta or tins of beans please. Biscuits and snacks and toiletries would also be welcome! We thank everyone who has responded so far – it has been a wonderful response.
