Lent Small Groups

We are hoping to start some small groups during Lent, the theme is 'Overflowing'. This will also be the subject of the service reflections in Lent. Wednesday is our traditional evening to hold these groups, though it could be another day. The series is 4 weeks Lent 1 - Matthew 4:1-11 Temptation of Jesus; Lent 2 - Exodus 16 Manna & Quail; Lent 3 - Exodus 32 Golden calf; and Lent 4/Mothering Sunday - Exodus 35 Offerings for the Worshipping Community. Please do this by Sunday 19th February, so that a decision can be made.

Foodbank We are thankful for all donations to the foodbank, who are struggling to supply the demand for food items at this difficult time. They are also asking if people have carrier bags that they can donate - the push for re-usable bags is successful for our environment, but the Food Banks have a shortage. If you can bring some into church and put them in the food donation boxes please that would be wonderful.

Turkey and Syria Earthquake Appeal.

As you'll likely have heard, a devastating 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck south-eastern Turkey near the border with Syria, followed a series of powerful aftershocks. This is the deadliest and most powerful recorded earthquake to hit Turkey in decades. Many thousands of men, women and children have died or are injured. But even before this devastating earthquake, there were over four million people in need of aid in Northwest Syria.

There will be a plate in church for the next few weeks for you to give a donation to the appeal. Christian Aid has a track record of working with local partners in Northwest Syria to provide winter kits to people seeking shelter. These kits include plastic sheeting, mattresses, blankets, and heating materials. Their appeal is for the situation in both Turkey and Syria. We have therefore chosen to send donations through the Christian Aid Appeal.

Right Buildings Review

This is part of a Diocesan assessment of all it's building including Churches and Church Halls. Its goal is to discern prayerfully and objectively which ones help us to best fulfil the mission Jesus is giving us today and in the future. The Right Buildings Review in Wigan will take a year, running from December 2022 to December 2023. There are 2 distinct phases: the Assessment phase which concludes with the Right Buildings Proposal in May 2023, and the consultation phase, in which the proposal is discussed with members of Church Wigan and important partners.

We are currently in the assessment stage. Team Leader, Cliff Unsworth reports "What I find really encouraging as the team goes through the assessment process is the way we have been welcomed and accepted at the building survey visits we have completed so far. We are encouraged that even though this is a difficult process, we truly believe that Church Wigan Worshipping Communities are behind us and God is alongside of us". As Michelle Prior, the other Team Leader said ... "Hard decisions have to be made but, to leave a sustainable legacy to future generations, we must get on and do it now."

School Links We are very pleased to report that 'Open the Book' has been able to resume at St Aidan's School. A team of parishioners go into school to enact a Bible story for the children bringing it to life. This has been on hold since Covid. Please pray for the team, and for other activities which strengthen the bond between Church and School.

Random Act of Kindness Day

Next Friday (17th) is known as 'Random Act of Kindness Day' when we are encouraged to show compassion and love towards others and, of course, as Christians, we do this in Jesus' name. There are many ways we can show God's love in what we do for others, by praying for others, contacting someone who is lonely, as well as giving to those who are in need. Let's share God's love widely next Friday.

Help with Audio Visual Support

We urgently need more people to run the laptop and projector systems during our 10 00 Sunday services. Ideally the person leading the service should not have to move the slides on themselves, and the laptop would be better situated at the back of church. We currently have too few volunteers and are almost at the point where we can't continue as we are. The system is not as scary as it looks and new volunteers will be properly trained and supported.
