A big thanks to all those who decorated church for our Harvest Festival. It looked amazing. Many thanks also to all those who donated food and financial contributions. This year they will be used in setting up the Food Pantry (see below) which is due to open in November.

You may already have read some of the following notices in the Church magazine -

Food Pantry:

We are now getting ready to open a Food Pantry at St Aidan's in November (date still to be confirmed). The pantry will be called Aidan's Pantry and will be open on a Friday afternoon 14.00 - 16.00.

The food pantry is being opened and funded by the Lifted Mission under the umbrella of Church Wigan and Wigan Deanery Trust. The difference between a Food Pantry and Food Bank is that the pantry is open to everyone.

Anyone wishing to shop at the pantry will pay ± 5 per year and will be allowed to buy 15 items for ± 3 every week. All the food is donated by supermarkets and factories like

Heinz. This not only stops food being sent to land fill sites but it also helps families of all age have access to food at a very low cost. There have been a number of pantries that have been opened throughout Church Wigan and have been proved not only to be successful in feeding people but become a social event where people can meet and have a chat. Once established we hope to be able to expand our Pantry into much more. Through the Lifted Mission we have access to lots of other organisations who can offer help and advice like Christians' Against Poverty.

We really want to make our pantry into a warm and welcoming place where the people of Billinge can not only have access to good cheap food but a place to make friends. However you want to use the Pantry everyone will be welcome.

An independent review into the 7 year Transforming Wigan Project which ended in 2021 has taken place by Kate Hutton of Integras Consulting. It was published on 21/09/23 and can be found on the Diocesan website in the section of news and events. See www.liverpool.anglican.org There is a full 56 page report or you may download a 6 page summary. It looks at how and why the Project was set up, its relevance, effectiveness, impact and sustainability. It reports on successes in mission and how changes in team benefice enabled quick adaptation and support during the Covid pandemic and also acknowledges that it was unable to turn around the downward trajectory in finances which burdens all churches at this time.

ANNOUNCEMENT READ IN WORSHIP SERVICES in Wigan South Sunday 1st October 2023 <u>From the PCC</u>

Many of you will know that a **Right Buildings Review** has been conducted this year throughout Church Wigan. This recognises that all our church buildings are precious and important, yet also that we can no longer afford to keep all of them. We need a smaller number of wisely sited church buildings which can fulfil the ongoing needs of traditional worship *and* help us engage in the new mission Jesus is giving us today. The Right Buildings Review was undertaken to help us do this.

Last week parish church councils met to consider the draft recommendations of the Right Buildings Review. We now want to host a series of open and honest conversations with congregations and other groups connected to our churches, to pray and discuss how we will move forward with those recommendations.

We invite you all to attend the conversations which we plan to take place after the morning service later this month. At that meeting you will be able to learn about the review and share your thoughts. Please try to be there: we want everyone to be involved.

We want to share the recommendations with you today, in preparation for the meetings.

Of the 31 church buildings in Church Wigan, twelve were deemed currently to offer a sustainable base for ministry without requiring large investment or development. Therefore they should be retained.

Four church buildings were identified as not easily supporting sustainable ministry without large investment and therefore should be released.

The remaining fifteen offer both potential and challenge for sustainable ministry and require significant investment or development. Sadly, Church Wigan does not have the resources to retain all of them. Thus, PCCs will review them urgently to discern which to retain or release.

In our Parish of Wigan South

- *St Aidan's, St Andrews and St Thomas* are recommended to be retained.
- *Holy Trinity and St Luke's* will be reviewed over the next months to assess sustainability and options before deciding whether to retain or release.
- *St Peter's* will continue to meet in the Brigade Hall, Bryn.

The PCC recognises that the Right Buildings Review, while supremely necessary, will bring pain to many. To do this well will mean doing it together, with the Holy Spirit and each other. Thank you.

Similar notices have been read out in each church in Church Wigan.

Changes in Church

You may remember that both Rev Jeremy Thomas and Rev Sue Fulford, our Team vicars have reduced their hours to part time because of personal need. The appointment of a new full time Team Vicar and Hub Leader for Wigan South is progressing. An advert was released on 26/09/23. The closing date for this is Monday 16th October and the Interviews are scheduled for 9th November. Please pray that God prompts the 'right person' to respond and apply for this post, and pray for those who will interview and select, that our individual churches and our joint Hub activities may receive the leadership needed to fulfil God's will for our parish and that we all feel supported in our mission and our spiritual walk with Jesus.

Helen has received 'Permission to Officiate' as Reader allowing her to continue to take a leadership role, lead services and preach.

As we know, Lesly is very accomplished in the role that she has been doing here at St. Aidan's.
