Right Buildings Review

We were all very relieved when we found that St. Aidan's was not being recommended for closure under the Right Building's Review, but that process across Wigan is ongoing. We need to improve our financial provision, but also we need to be able to show how we are engaging with our community in worship and activities. Our building cannot be just for Sunday worship, nor would we wish it to be. It now has more community use than ever, with the introduction of Aidan's Pantry, but could we do more? In late September a team of leaders from St. Aidan's will be meeting with our Hub clergy to do a review of St Aidan's and our mission, as part of the ongoing 'Right Buildings Review'. Please continue to pray for the use of our church building.

A Service review

On Monday July 22nd many of the team of people who help to provide your services each month came together to evaluate our current organisation and practices in services and to look at how we continue to glorify God through our worship and serve the community in which we serve. This included service leaders, those who read scripture, do intercessions and communion. A big thank you to Rev Sue F who came along to support us in this. We thought about the ethos and vision that we have as a church. That vision may be different for different types of service and activity. We provide a range of worship styles each month for a range of people. Our vision is both for those who have been with us for many years, but also for those whom God is calling even now. The vision shared by members included: Reach out to the community with God's love in practical ways and in worship, modelling God's love to that community; showing a united church; building stronger links with school; growing disciples and building relationships.

We will need to condense these visions down to make an over-riding statement for vision for the whole church. This will be very useful for when we meet for the Right Buildings review. What is your vision? What activities do you think would help us to glorify God and serve our community. It has been suggested that we have a 'suggestion box' at the back of church. Join in the debate by posting your thoughts.
