In September the Hub churches will be joining together to use the theme of Giving in Grace. This will focus on 4 readings from Luke's Gospel. If you want to read them for a sneak preview you will find them as follows:

Sept 1st Luke 12:13 – 21 the rich fool; Sept 7th Luke 19:1-10 Zaccheus; Sept 15th Luke 21:1-4 the widow's mite and Sept 22nd Luke 18:18-30 the Rich Ruler. This will also be the theme of the Hub service on September 29th.

Sta's4all look forward to being back together in St Aidan's School on the 2nd Sunday of the month starting at 10.30am. The theme this month is Daniel in the Lion's Den. This is a reminder that Sta's4all is short for St. Aidan's for everyone. You do not have to have a child attending St. Aidan's school in order to be able to come. Even pensioners have come in the past to enjoy some craft activities and puzzles on a theme, refreshments, time to chat to others and a relaxed style of worship. All are welcome.

Craft Fair


